Programmatic Assessment worksheet (30-45 minutes)


How might we/l decide how we assess in our course so that we support learning and competency development?



Intended Learning Objective (ILO)

Instructions:

- Choose one of your Intended Learning Outcomes and write it the first box.
- 2. Read your ILO and brainstorm. What could we do to assess it? Come up with as many ideas as you can. Tip: if you get stuck, go back to the ILO and make it more specific.
- 3. Now consider all ideas and vote the ones that you think it would be most suitable to assess that specific ILO you considered. Each brainstorm participant get 3 votes and they can distribute them freely on all ideas (e.g. all 3 in one, one vote for different ideas, etc.)
- 4. Based on the result of the voting round, brainstorm again: what learning activities could we set up to match this assessment?
- 5. Consider all ideas and vote again (again, each participant gets 3 votes) for the most suitable learning activities.
- 6. Bring the most voted ideas to the next exercise.



2 Course/Project Blueprint

Instructions:

- 1. Take the voted assessment ideas and the learning activities ideas and plot them over the duration of your course/project. How many times will you perform that (formative/summative) assessment? When will the activities occur?
- 2. Once you are done, you will have a basic blueprint of your course/project.
- 3. You can go back to the previous exercise, choose another ILO, repeat the process and integrate your blueprint with more learning activities and assessments.
